#### Ad Hoc Working Party Sessions

## **Basic Assessment Revision**

# **Showing Honey at Agricultural Shows**

- We are trying to encourage this to keep the honey classes alive in the small shows. All the shows on the previous slide have honey classes
- It costs very little to enter and the classes vary from show to show
- Often there is a beginners class
- It's fun and you may learn things about your honey
- You may even win your entry fee back and a certificate or a cup if you're lucky
- Classes are in the show schedule you do need to enter in advance
- You can enter the same jars of honey at all the shows!
